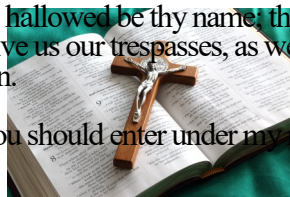
Apostles Creed

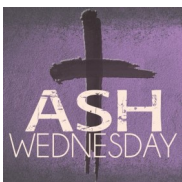

Black History Month

Servant of God, Thea Bowman - Born December 29, 1937. Black Catholic religious sister, musician, liturgist and scholar from Mississippi. Nominated Servant of God, the first step toward becoming a saint, Thea was part of the civil rights movement, a fighter for education for Blacks. She helped create a Catholic hymnal specifically designed for black worshipers. *Lead Me, Guide Me: The African American Catholic Hymnal*, was published in 1987 with the collaboration of James P. Lyke, Auxiliary Bishop of Cleveland. She also released many albums and gave inspirational talks to the black. She died of cancer on March 30, 1990.
