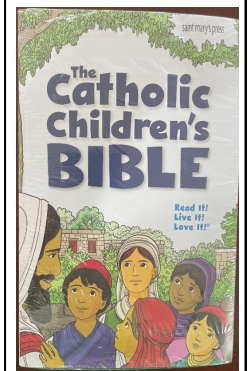

My dear Parishioners,



The Catholic Church highlights the wondrous gift of the Eucharist twice on her liturgical calendar. First on Holy Thursday, we celebrate its institution when Christ breaks bread and shares wine with the Apostles. For everlasting memory, He says, with the bread in hand, "This is my body that is for you." And with the chalice, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it in remembrance of me." The Savior, Who is the unblemished Lamb, unites His Passover meal with the sacrifice of the Cross. As one biblical scholar put it, "The Jews offered animal sacrifices to God, believing that life was in the blood, and the animal blood was a substitute for human lifeblood. Following this Jewish tradition, Jesus offered his own lifeblood as a substitute for the lifeblood of all human beings and, so, sealed the New Covenant made between God and humankind bring new life to the world." In short on the altar of the Cross, Christ is both priest and victim, offering Himself once and for all for our salvation. The Apostles, who were the first priests, offered this sacrifice and this meal in memory of His Life, Death, and Resurrection, as their forefathers offered the Passover meal in memory of their deliverance from Pharaoh. And this same sacrifice and meal is brought forward to us in the celebration of the Holy Mass.

The same Church celebrates on this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the mystery and the truth of the Real Presence. What is offered to us under the signs of bread and wine is in fact Christ's Body and Blood. When the Savior took the bread and wine into His hands, He had a far greater intention. Again, I go to His words, "This is my Body, this is my Blood." He did not say this is a facsimile, this is a symbol, this is a metaphor, no Christ meant what He said! We know this because of the Apostle John. It is recounted in the sixth chapter of his Gospel narrative that many take offense to the Savior's teaching that one must eat His flesh and drink His blood if they wish to have eternal life. Many take leave of Jesus prompting Him to ask Simon Peter if you would do likewise? To which the fisherman replies, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." (Jn 6: 68-69) Prior to blessed Peter's statement of faith, Christ links what will become His Eucharist to the manna and quail that God provided for the Jews during their long desert sojourn to the Promised Land. In short, Christ had ample opportunity to dispel any misunderstanding on the part of His listeners, but He is emphatic on this point, one must partake of Jesus' flesh and blood to have a part in Him! Across time and eternity, in the elements of food and drink, God demonstrates His desire to be near to His people, near to all of us, hence Christ real, true, and abiding presence in the Eucharist. It is the food that will strengthen us on this pilgrimage through towards life everlasting.

In conclusion, we celebrate on Holy Thursday the beginnings of this great Sacrament. This day, Corpus Christi, we celebrate what is conveyed by said Sacrament, under the appearances of bread and wine, the Savior's desire to accompany us and to transform us through and through by being presence to us, but also providing for our spiritual hunger. Allow me to leave with the opening prayer for this Sunday's Mass:

*O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament
have left us a memorial of your Passion,
grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries
of your Body and Blood
that we may always experience in ourselves
the fruits of your redemption.
Who live and reign with God the Father
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

God Up There, God Down Here Fr. Joseph Juknialis

Just as the darkest of nights brings out stars we might never notice otherwise, so is it that when we find ourselves lost in the dark of life's deserts, the slightest kindnesses can bring us to a brief oasis in a day otherwise oppressive. Most often, such moments come as gifts, unearned—even undeserved. Yet, they are blessings to us.

Psychologists tell us that if we find ourselves down in the dumps and depressed, we can find hope by naming three things that happened that day that were pure gifts—a phone call from a friend, a compliment, a free cup of coffee, a good bill of health from the doctor. Remembering them at the end of the day and giving thanks for them may not solve the issues that burden us, but they can put them in perspective, reminding us that life is a mix of both the good and the not-so-good.

Moses urged the people to recall all that God had done for them—bringing them out of Egypt, guiding them through the desert, leading them to water, and feeding them with manna. Amid their grumbling, their remembering offered them hope and the courage to go on.

Thus, what psychologists suggest is what God has been doing for us for thousands of years—God feeds us daily in large and small ways, all without our deserving it but out of his great generosity. Remember, then, how God has fed you.

Called to Gratitude and Community The Redemptorists

My husband died two weeks ago. We had been together for almost thirty-four years. Grief has made me vulnerable in ways I've never been before.

The physical absence of one's beloved becomes the entire landscape of the survivor's life. C.S. Lewis once wrote, after the death of his wife, that he hadn't expected grief to feel so much like fear. I will take it further: grief is an immense form of panic. A person is gone, and I cannot get him back. My pain is unendurable, and I can't make it stop. I feel this desperate need to escape my very body.

And this is why faith must now be substance, and the body of Christ must do what I cannot. These recent days, I have been held by that entity we call the body of Christ. My only prayers have been tears and wailing; I have had to lean on the prayers of the people, the prayers of believers who love me, the Eucharist. I've left all the praying to the expansive body of Christ. I've left any comprehensible words about this loss to the reading of the Scriptures and the Liturgy of the Word.

I have allowed Christ's body to bring me food, organize my kitchen, and help with visiting family. I have depended on Christ's mystical, global body to hold me up, with my own will being involved hardly at all. I can speak what I believe, but my words have no weight or substance, and that is all right because Truth does not need me to hold it up or argue for its existence. An individual's faith has room and time to falter and grow silent for a while. While my faith stays hidden in its protective space, the many members of Christ's body carry on and keep everything moving and breathing and growing. Faith truly is the substance of our hope.

According to St. Thomas Aquinas, spiritual Communion is "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received him." Pope St. John Paul II said, "It is good to cultivate in our hearts a constant desire for the sacrament of the Eucharist. This was the origin of the practice of 'spiritual Communion,' which has happily been established in the Church for centuries and recommended by saints.... Saint Teresa of Jesus wrote, 'When you do not receive Communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual Communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it, the love of God will be greatly impressed on you'" (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 34).
